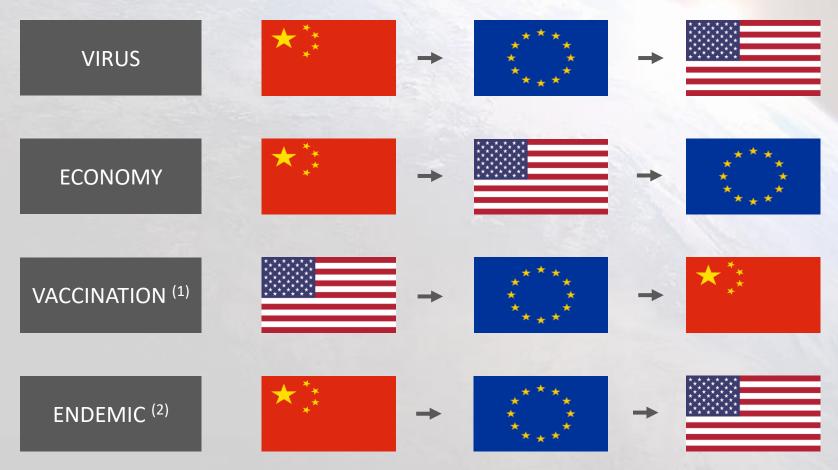

Covid-19 was and still is global, but not symmetric at all



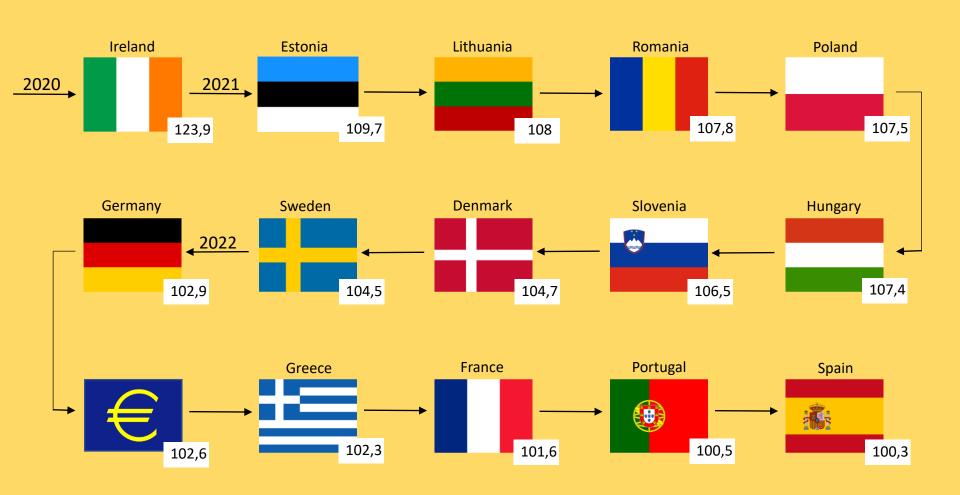
- (1) First 6 months of vaccines inoculation

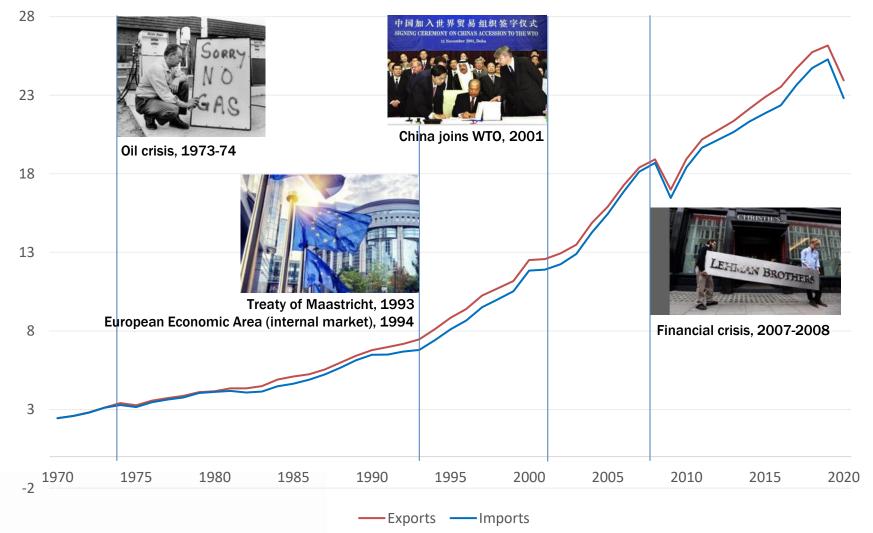

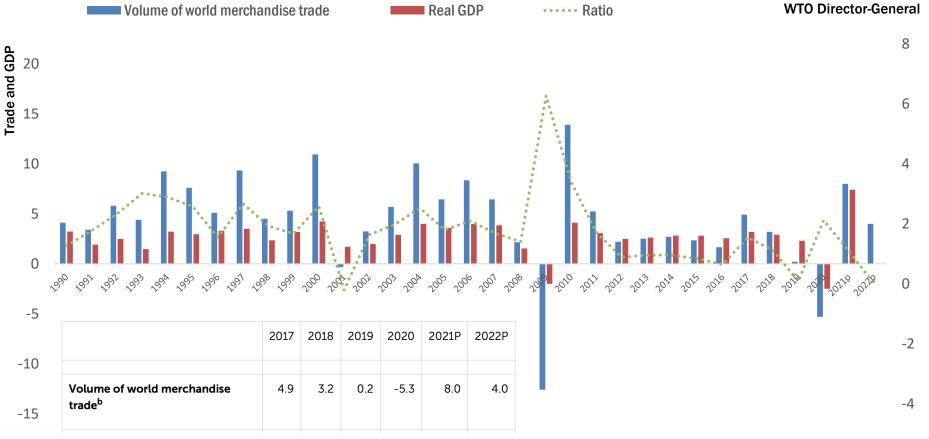

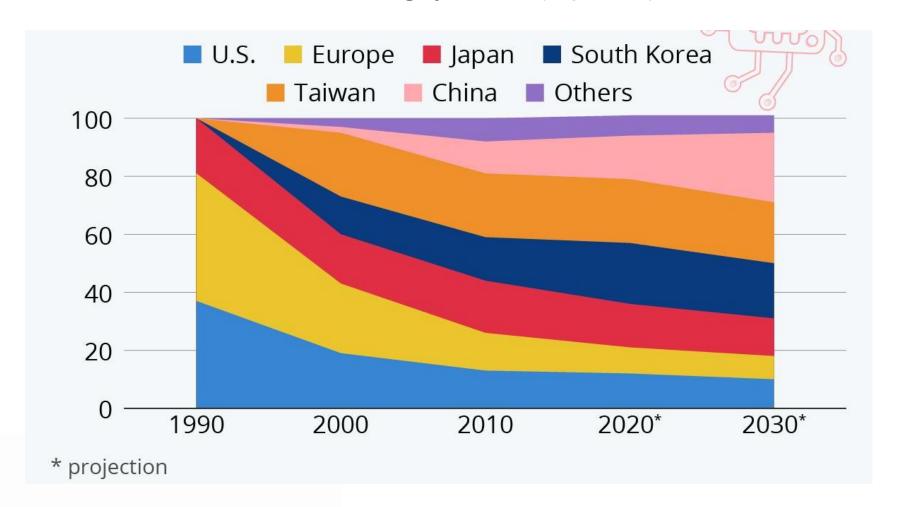

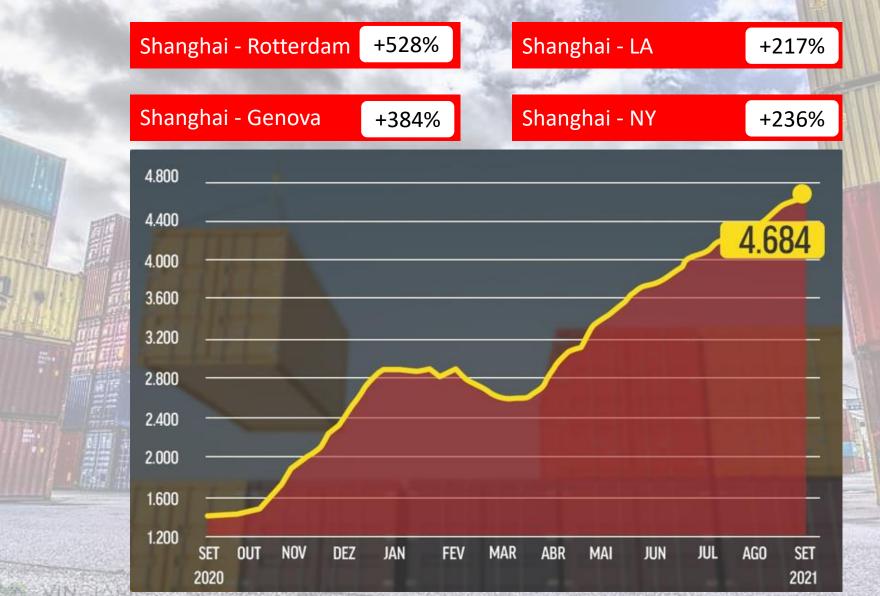

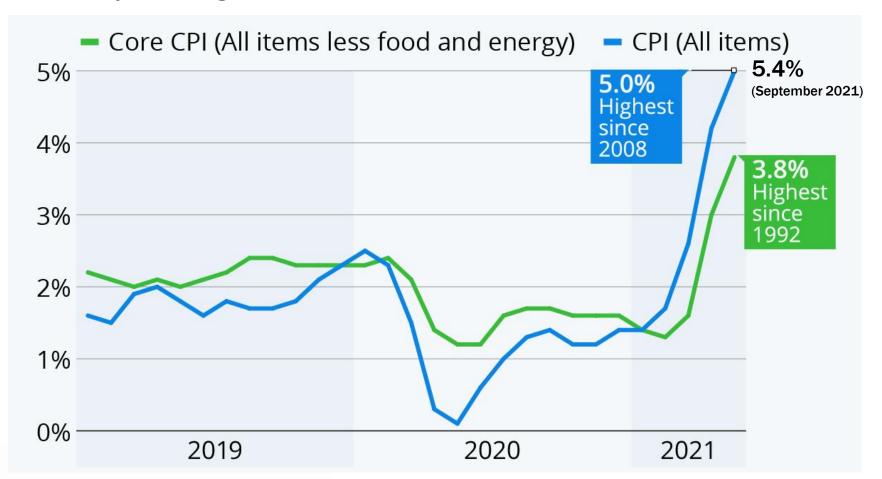
ECONOMY OF SCARCETY: HOW TRANSPORT PRICES (AND CALENDARS) ARE DISTURBING MARKETS

CORE INFLATION SHOOTS TO HIGHEST LEVEL SINCE 1992: FACING AN OVERALL PRICE INCREASE

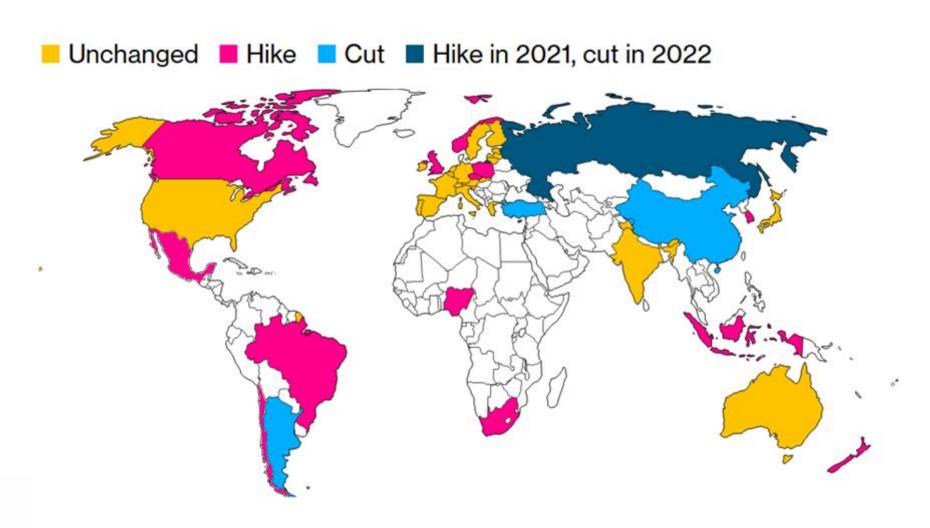
Year-over-year change in the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers in the US

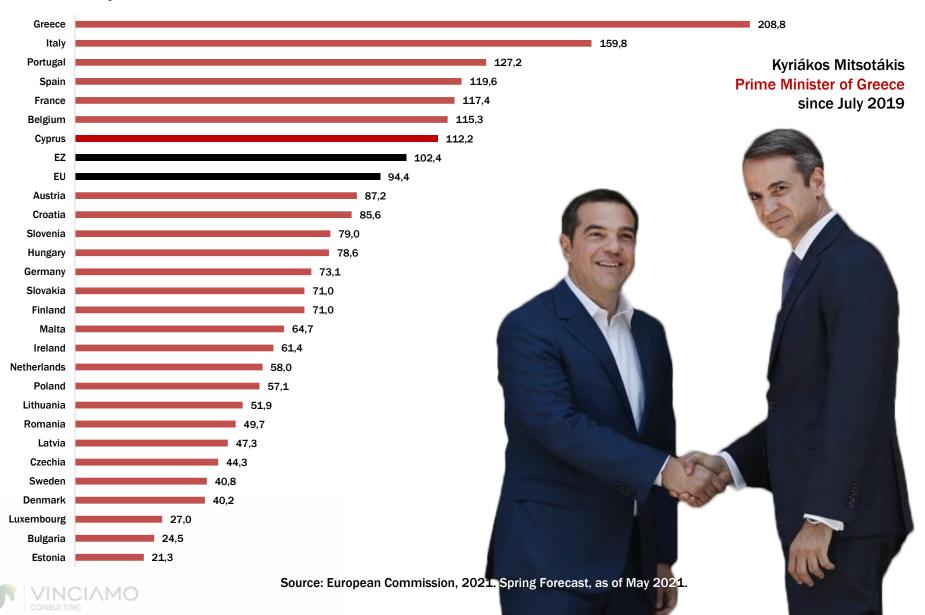

HOW DID WE GET HERE?

Government borrowing has ballooned as a percentage of GDP over the last decade.

It started during the Great Recession, when the government passed several stimulus measures to resuscitate the economy.

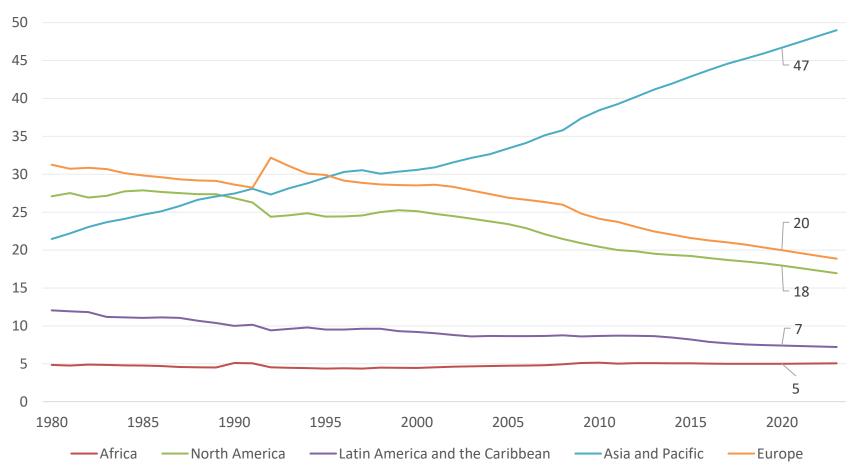
The national debt should have subsided as tax revenues recovered, but massive tax cuts in 2017 only added more red ink.

All that debt is only sustainable if interest rates remain as low as they have been on account of the Federal Reserve's prolonged strategy of buying US Treasuries in order to stimulate the economy.

But an interest rate shock would swamp many deeply indebted companies in short order.

Share of global real GDP PPP (%)



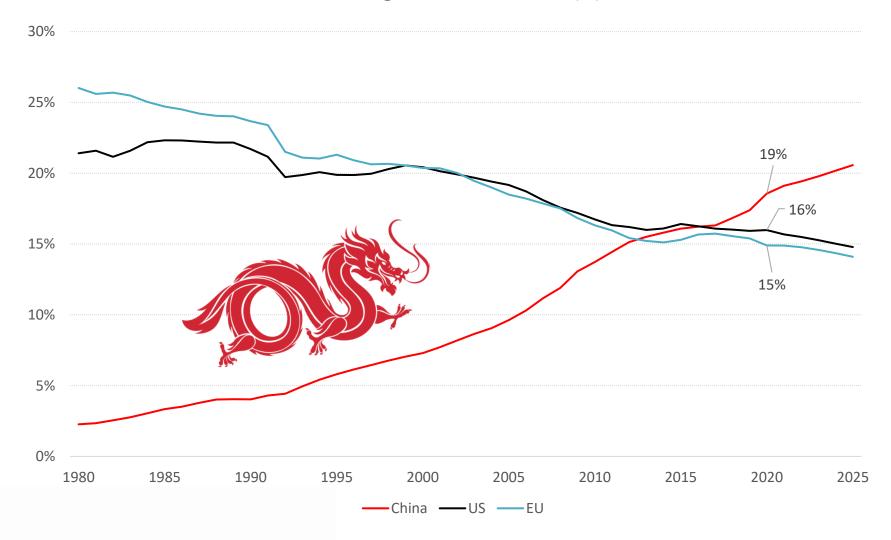
The chart above shows the percentage share of world's real GDP split by continents, and illustrates that the share of world's real GDP in the Asian region grew considerably faster than all other continents, from 16.8% in 1960 to 46.7% in 2020. Projections until 2023 show trends being reinforced.

Share of global real GDP PPP (%)

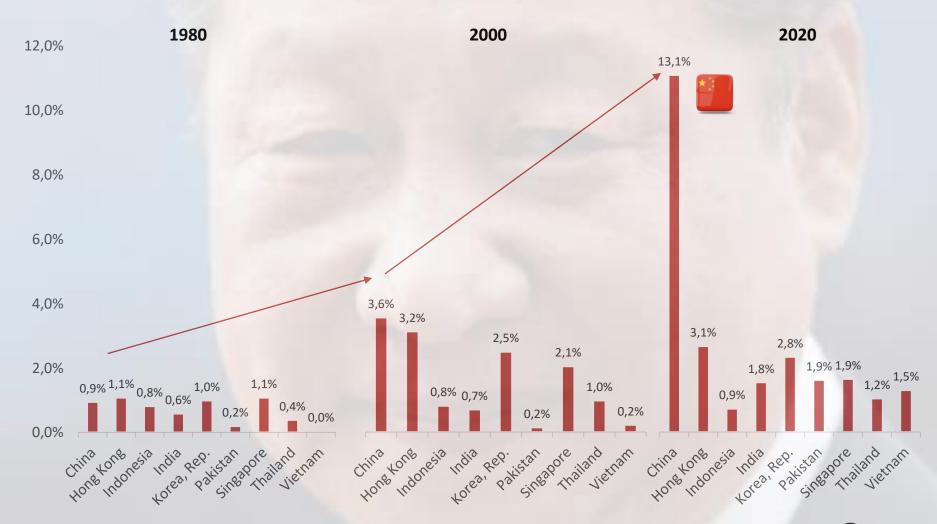

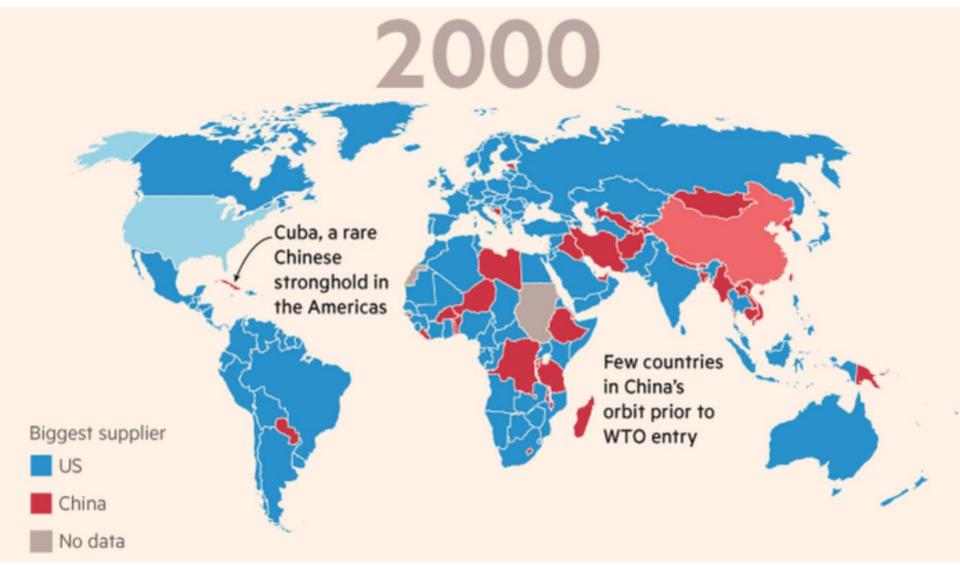
Selected WTO Members Merchandise Trade (% global trade)

US or China as larger supplier of goods, 2000

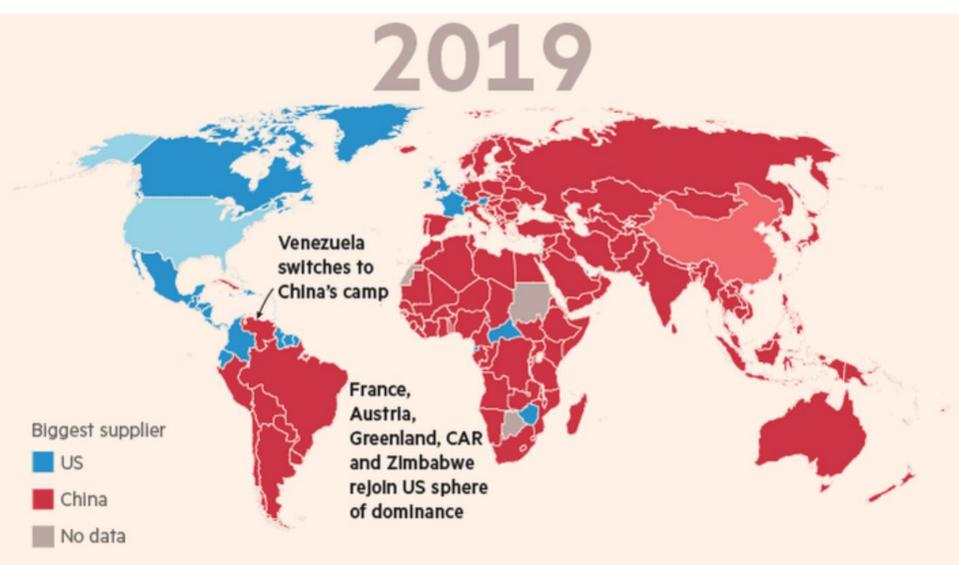

US or China as larger supplier of goods, 2019



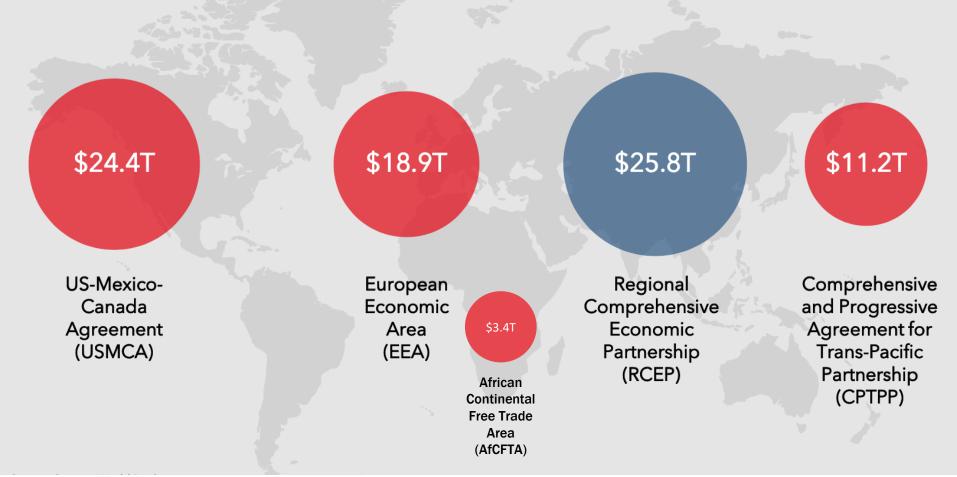

In the weeks following the November 2020 US election, 15 Asia-Pacific countries representing 30% of global GDP signed the world's largest free trade agreement, called RCEP

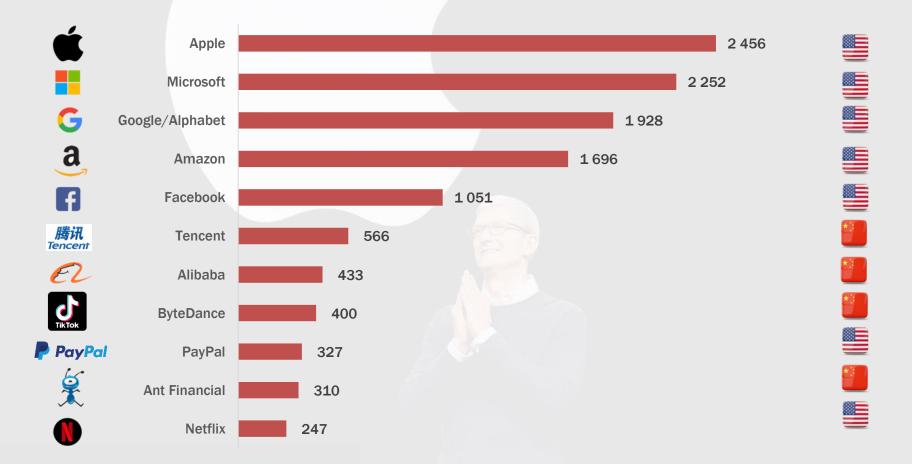
Total 2019 GDP of member countries of selected regional free trade agreements

Market capitalization of the largest internet companies worldwide (bn USD)

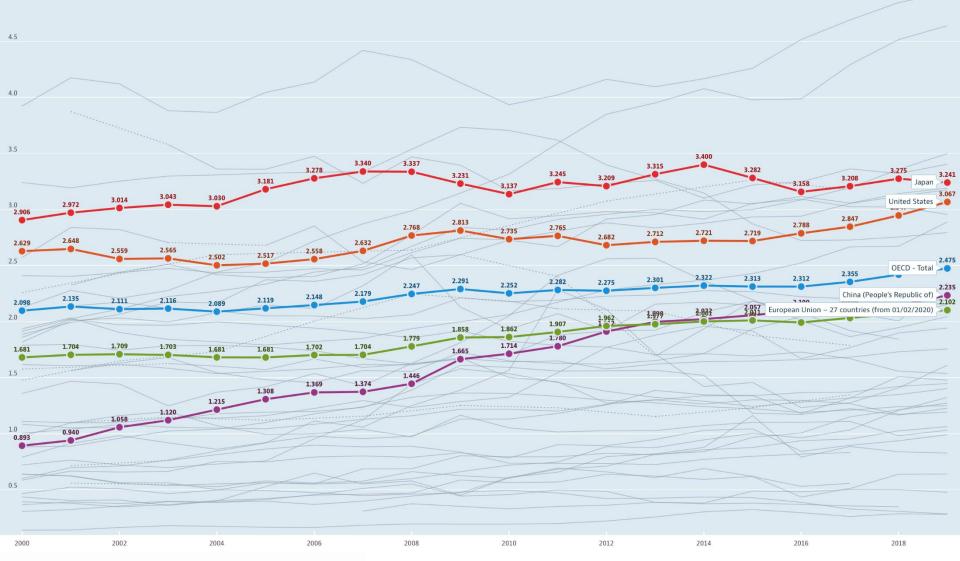

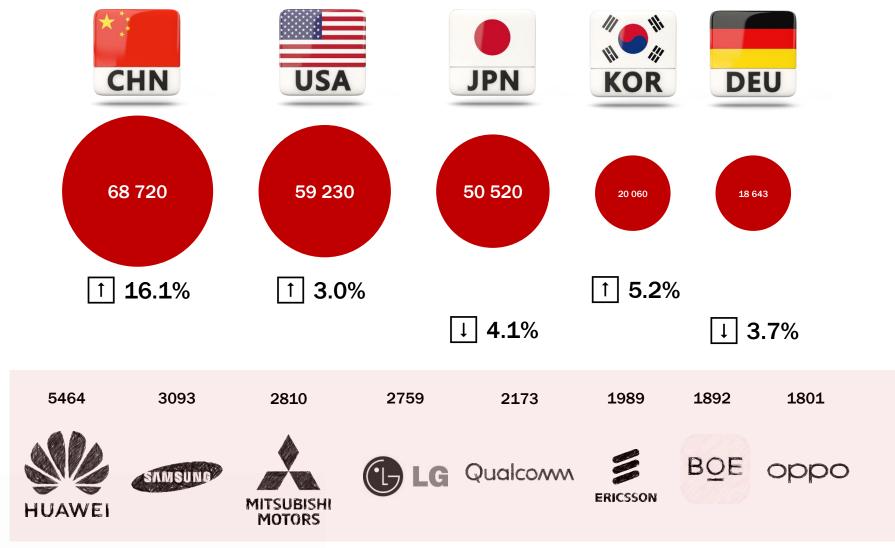
Gross domestic spending on R&D. Total, % of GDP

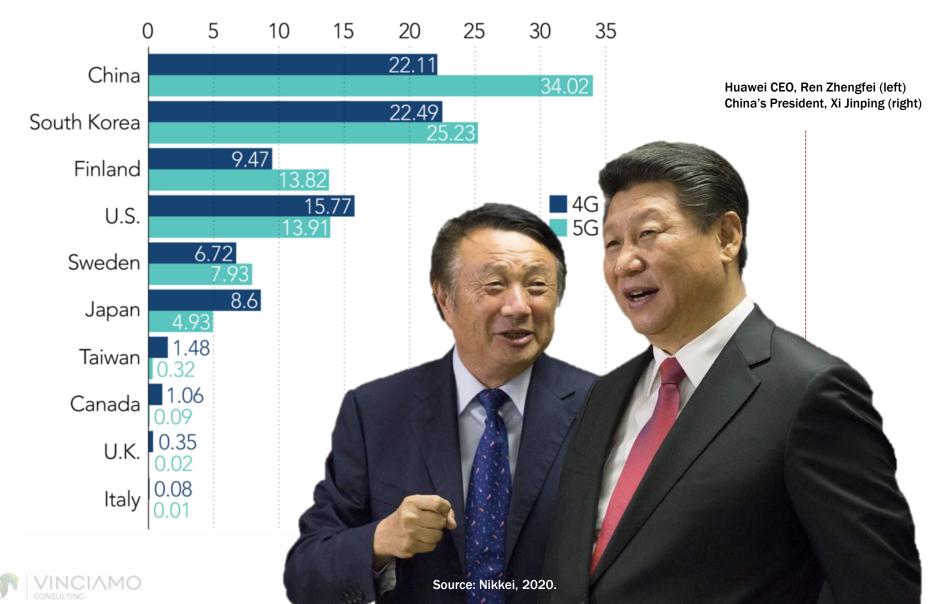

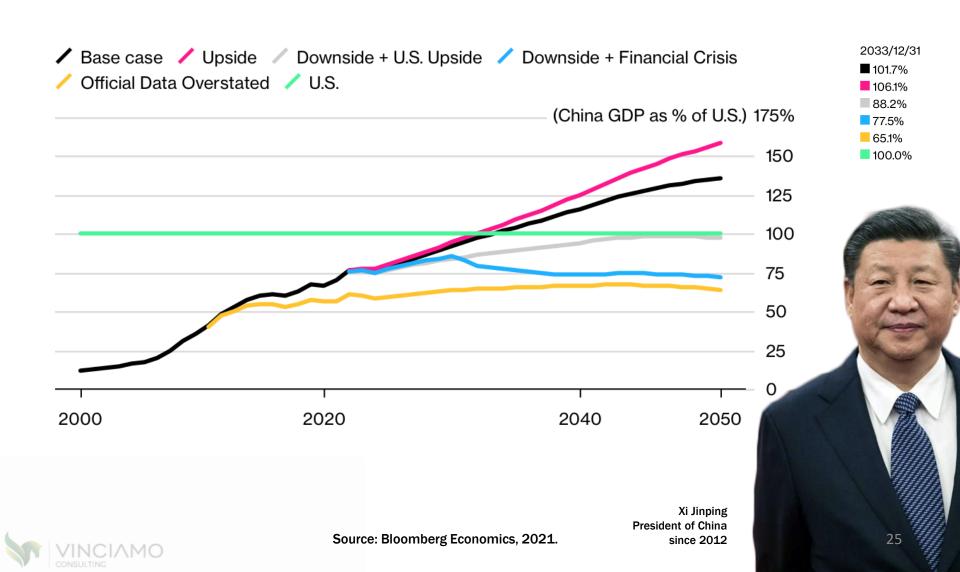
WHERE 4G AND 5G PATENT HOLDERS COME FROM

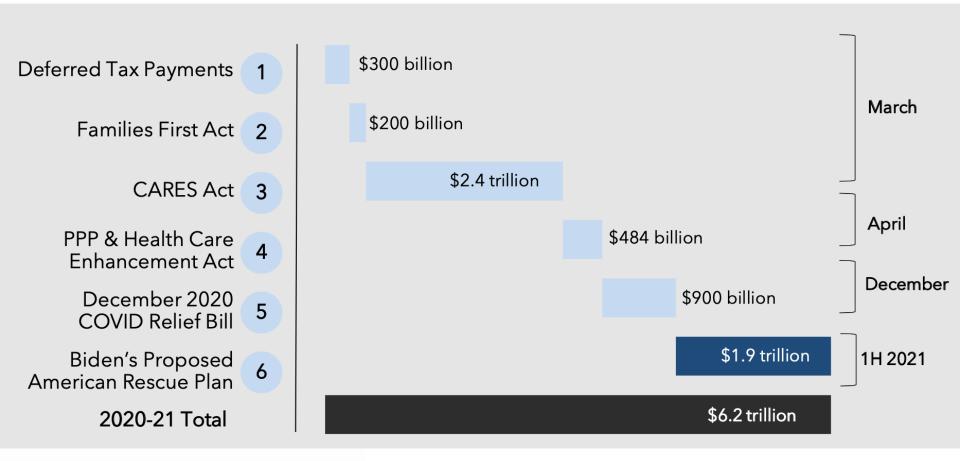

THE ECONOMIC PLAN TO FIGHT COVID-19

In 2020, the US Congress and Treasury Department facilitated \$4.3 trillion of COVID related fiscal stimulus, already the largest stimulus in history at close to 20% of GDP. President Biden has released a plan for an additional \$1.9 trillion of stimulus that he hopes to pass in the first half of 2021.

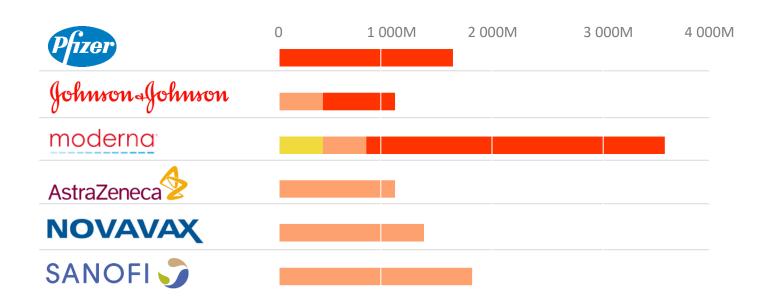

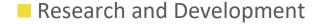

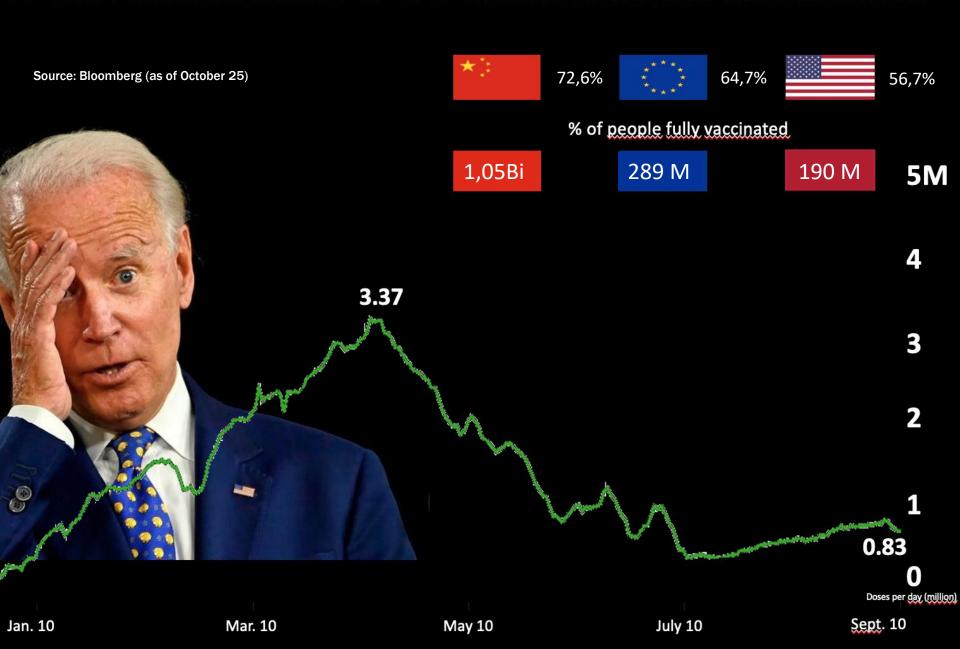




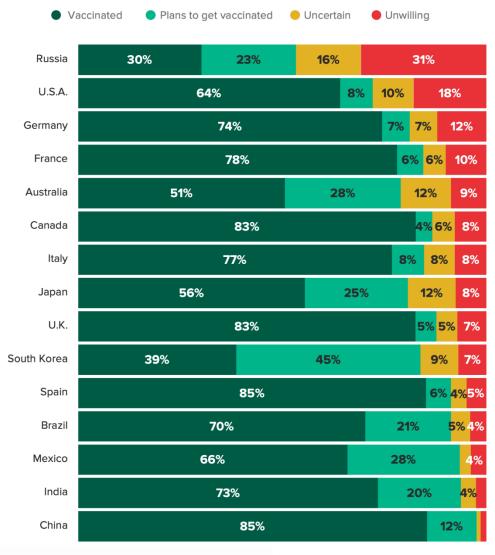

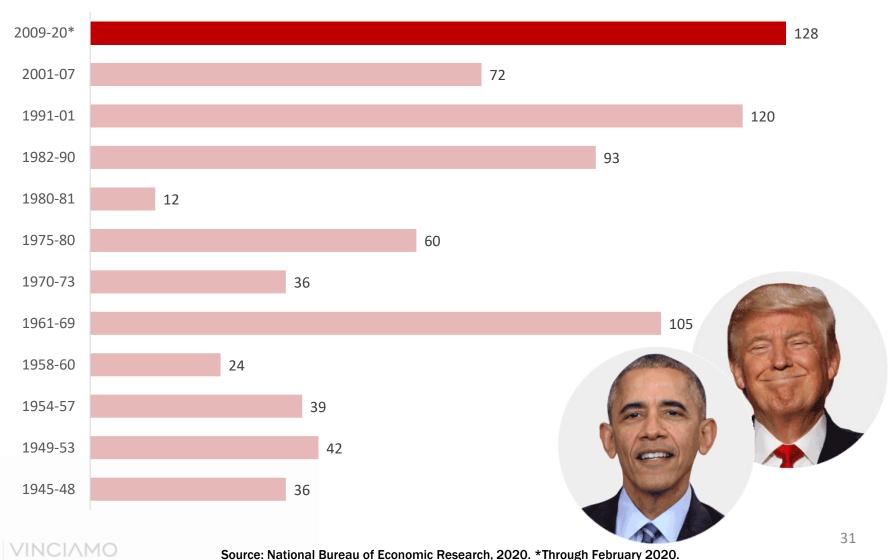
THE US HAS A HIGHER RATE OF VACCINE OPPOSITION THAN ANY COUNTRY TRACKED BESIDES RUSSIA

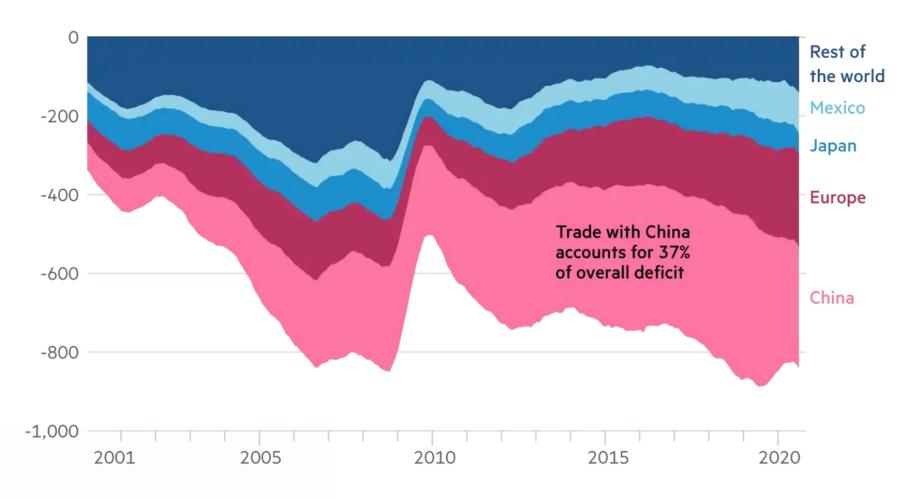

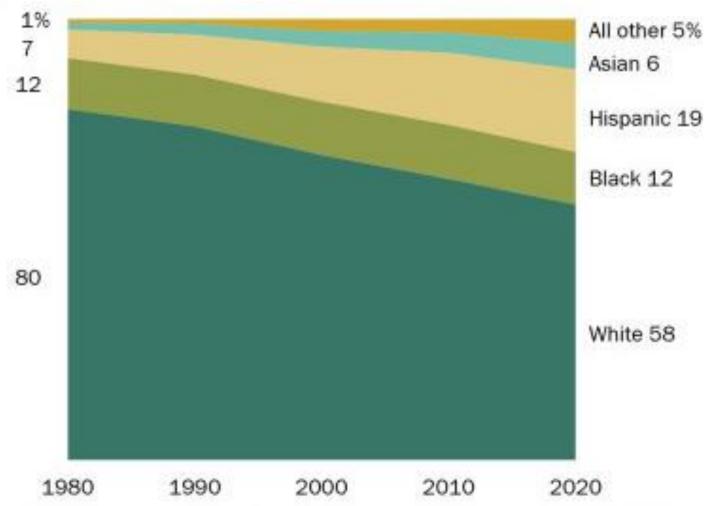
Net trade in goods, rolling 12-month total (\$bn)

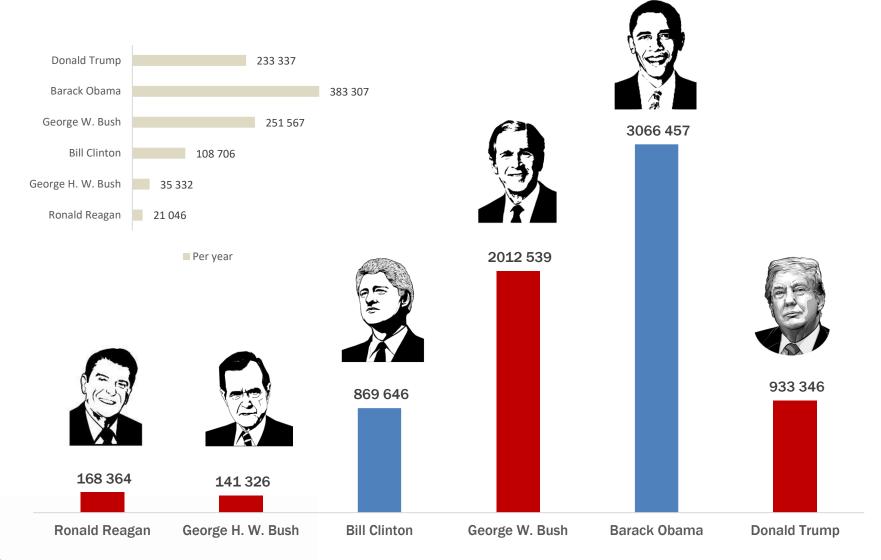
% of US population, by race and ethnicity

Total Immigration Removals, by US Administration

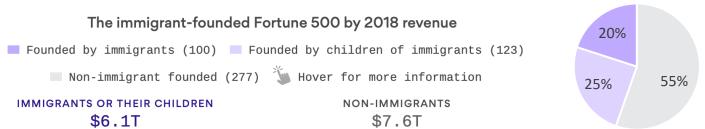

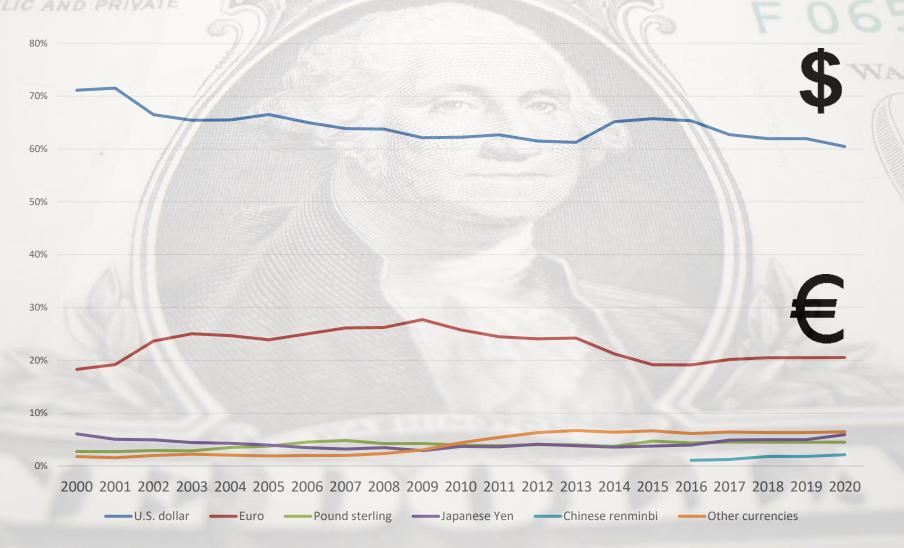
On average, they employ 11% more people than the average Fortune 500 company with a nonimmigrant founder

Share of currencies in global foreign exchange reserves



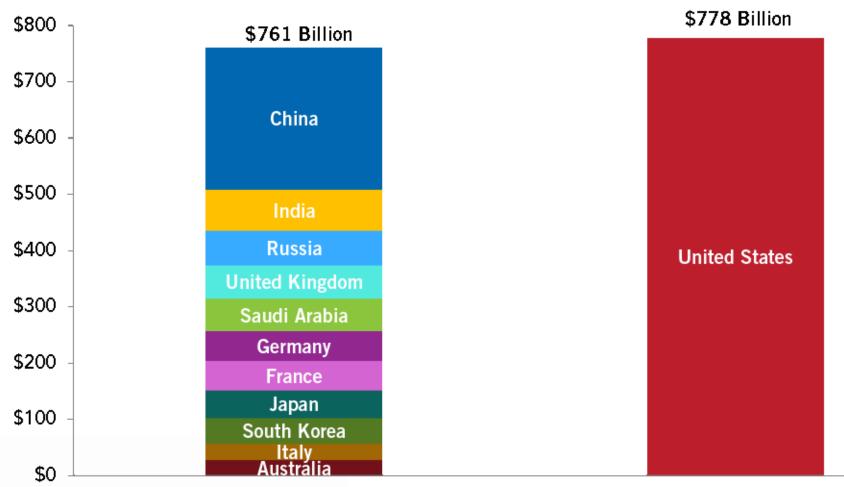

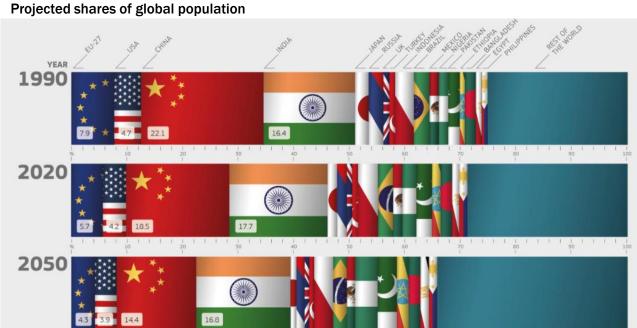

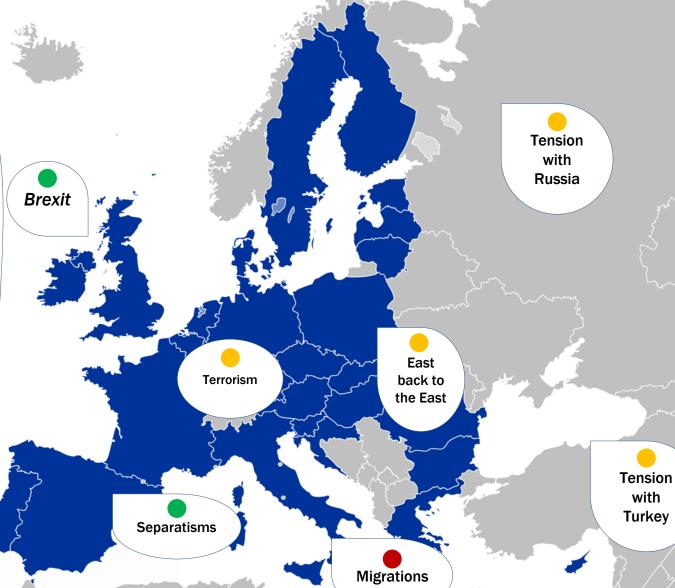

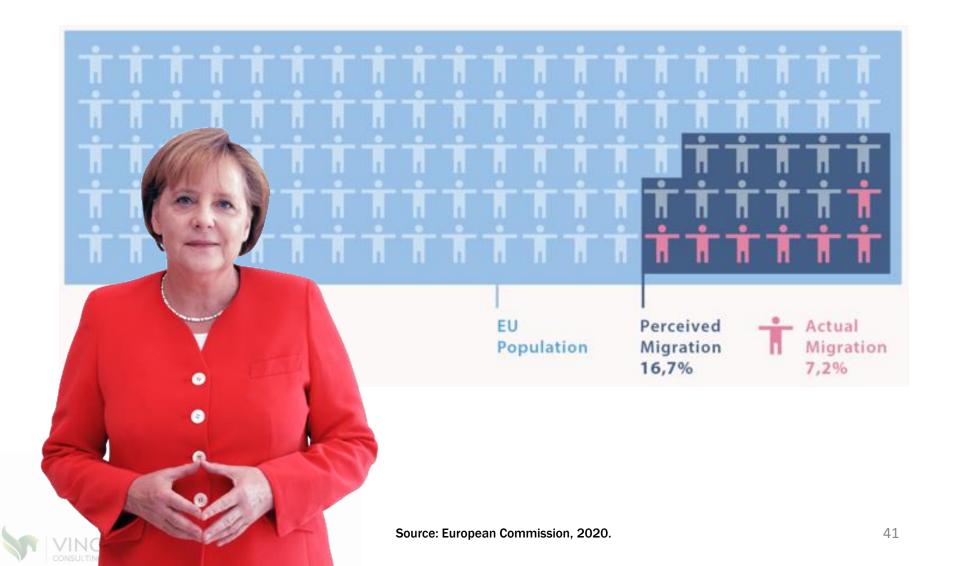

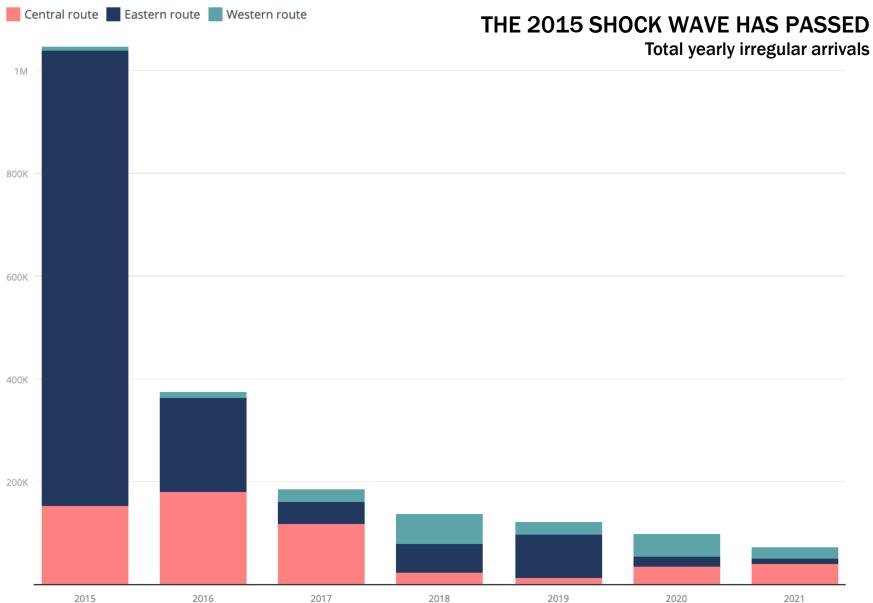

Share of non-EU migrants in population: perceptions vs reality



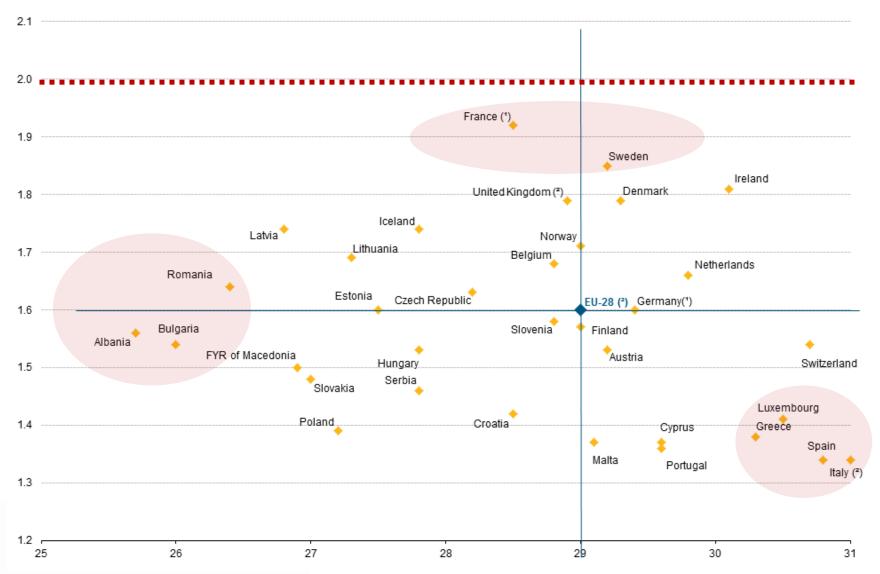

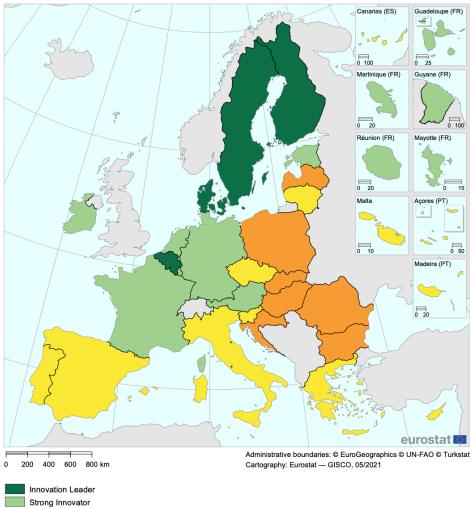

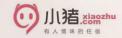

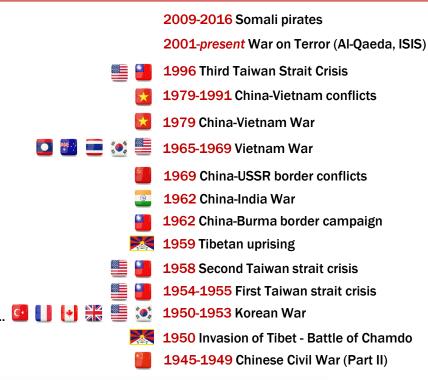

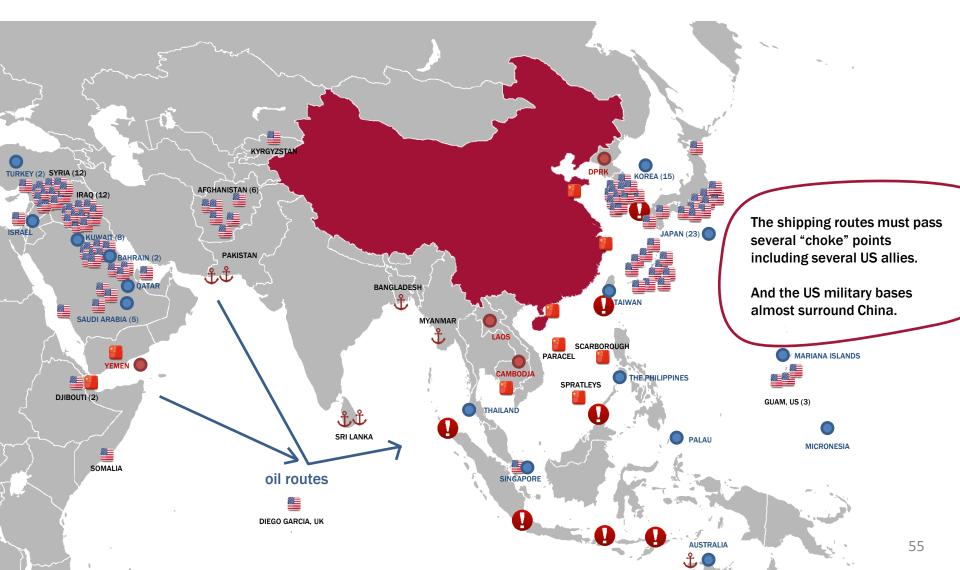

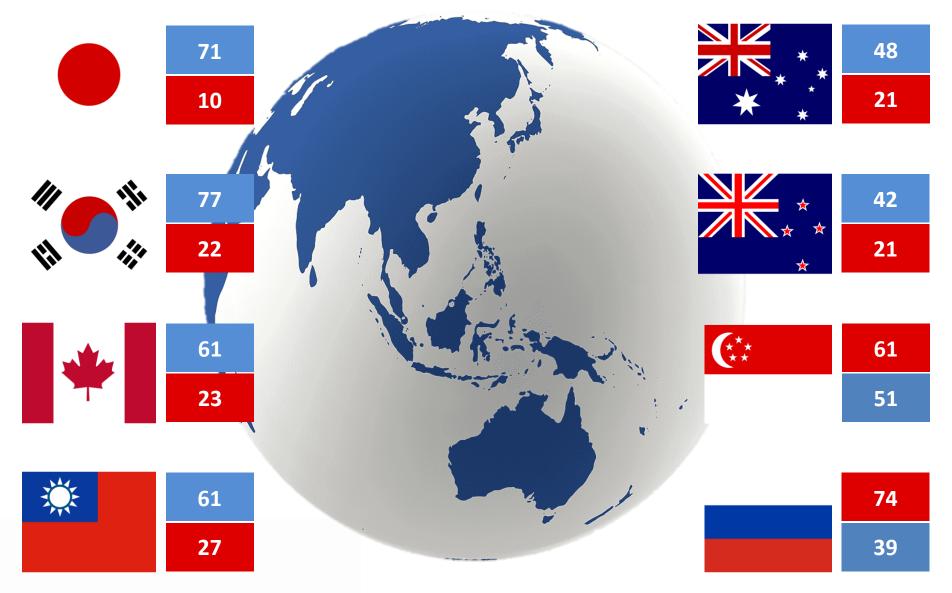
With most of its population in the coast, surrounded by desert and mountains, China imports 64.4% of the oil needed. Most of it by shipping

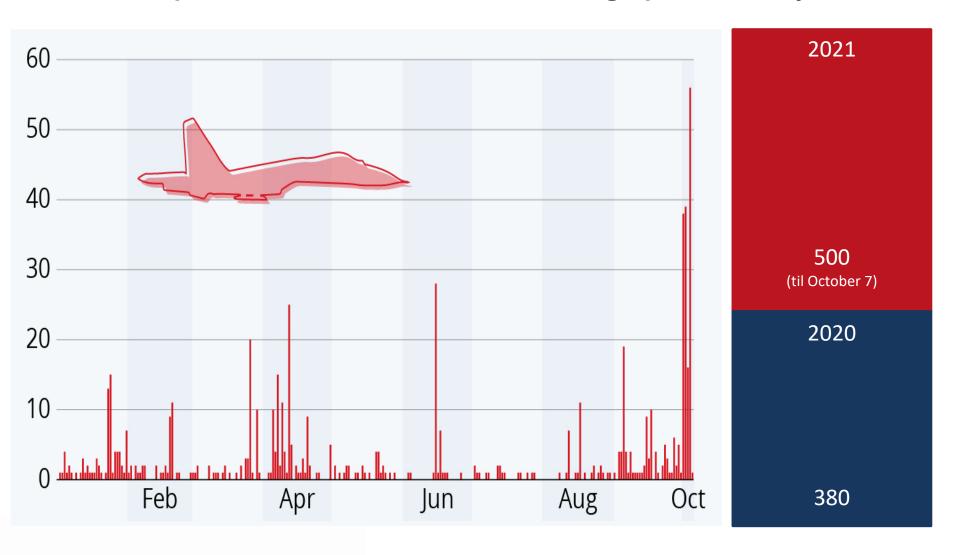

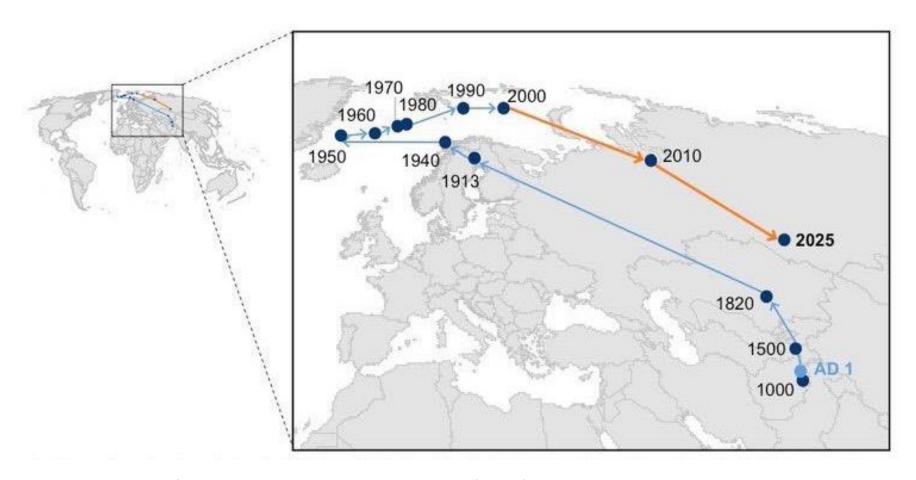

THE MOST RAPID SHIFT

IN THE WORLD'S ECONOMIC CENTER OF GRAVITY

Evolution of the earth's economic center of gravity (AD 1 to 2025)



The economic center of gravity is calculated by weighting locations by GDP in 3 dimensions and projected to the nearest point on the earth's surface. The surface projection of the center of gravity shifts north over the course of the century, reflecting the fact that in 3-dimensional space America and Asia are not only "next" to each other, but also "across" from each other.
